Pope Francis reminds us in his encyclical, Laudato Si':

"Today... we have to realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." (#49). Perhaps the grace we should ask for during these 40 days is to allow ourselves to be deeply transformed, renewed, converted, and to become more gentle, so that our thoughts, our words, and our actions can be transformative.

The voices of the poorest people are heard "like a voice that cries out in the desert". They are thirsty for an oasis of humanity, a space where they can be present, and be heard. During this Lenten season, we are able to reach out in a privileged way to the most fragile people around us — and to the most vulnerable part in ourselves — to welcome, to listen and to allow ourselves to be transformed little by little. We can learn from their words and their life experiences and "meditate on them in our hearts". We can be inspired by them and let ourselves be converted.

We can therefore create the conditions for them to share their "human expertise", of resilience and of hope...Then, little by little, our walk will become a "caravan" of humanity, of communion.

Our earth is also crying out in pain. We now know that we are responsible for the future of many peoples. This fertile and luxuriant Garden of Creation is being destroyed. Let us make the most of this Lenten period, a time of desert par excellence, to focus on the essential in our lives. By living in the desert, we can choose to live in voluntary and happy simplicity. May the winds of sand rid us of what is superfluous and may the tent of our heart gradually be uncluttered and made wider. Changing our relationship with Creation and changing our relationship with life is one and the same conversion.
